

PLANS NEARLY COMPLETE FOR NEW FIRE STATION

DETAILS OF STRUCTURE FOR OAK LAWN ARE ANNOUNCED.

**Will Follow Oak Cliff and Fair Park
Houses with Red Tile
Gabled Roof.**

Plans for the new fire station in Oak Lawn are nearing completion at the hands of **Hubbell & Greene** and it is declared that the new station will, in point of beauty, be the best in the city. On general lines it is to follow the plan of the Oak Cliff and the Fair Park stations, being as much better adapted as the study of the stations makes advisable and about the same in the matter of cost.

The first floor will provide for a chemical and hose wagon, a hook and ladder or a reel outfit and for a buggy. Stalls for the necessary horses for the apparatus will be arranged. Behind there will be the feed storehouse and the long cement base for the drying of the hose in bad weather. On top of the feed department will be the flat roof to be used for the hose drying in good weather and for a lounging place for the men of the station.

Over the main part of the building will be the adequate quarters for the men, their sleeping room, gymnasium, office, bath rooms, closets, locker space and general accommodations.

Instead of the flat roof common to most of the stations, there will be a raised and gabled effect with red Spanish tiling.
