

## CHRISTIAN SCIENTISTS' NEW CHURCH COMPLETE

STRUCTURE COSTING \$100,000 TO  
 BE OCCUPIED SUNDAY, JAN. 7.

**Furnishings Not All in Place and Service Intended for Tomorrow Is Postponed.**

On Sunday, Jan. 7, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, will meet in the new church building at the southeast corner of Browder and Cadiz streets, an edifice lately completed at a cost of about \$100,000. Because the furnishings will not all be in place in time, the use intended for Sunday, Dec. 31, has been postponed for one week.

The church of stone and steel is of Ionic design, following the classic lines strictly, inside and out. It was designed by **Hubbell & Greene** architects, and has been under construction since September, 1910. Because accuracy in treatment and a careful construction of all parts was required, the time has been long. It is intended that the structure shall be as lasting as it is ornamental. The pillared entrance is on Browder street, but there is a portico and smaller entrance on Cadiz, also classically pillared.

Within the church has pilasters and colonnades. The lighting by day is through large, plain windows, beautifully colored, and by a large dome of glass,

copper framed, over the central section. By night the illumination is by electric lights, affording indirect lighting, so that the glare is nowhere allowed to strike the eye.

Pews were delayed in shipment and the carpets were held at sea by storm, so that it was impossible to finish the interior fittings on schedule time.

The great organ, whose front was specially designed by the architects on the same classic lines as those of the church, is ready at a cost of \$15,000. It is declared to be the finest pipe organ in the South or Southwest.

The pews are to be of heavy quarter-sawed oak, specially designed for this auditorium.

The church sits on a lot somewhat more than 100 by 150 feet in dimension.

The building committee has Sam P. Cochran, chairman; Judge J. J. Eckford, J. C. Jones, C. H. Jones and W. A. Benton.
