

# CONTRACT AWARDED FOR SUNDAY SCHOOL

## WESTMINSTER PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH TO ERECT \$25,000 STRUCTURE.

Contract for a new Sunday school building for Westminster Presbyterian Church to cost \$25,000 was awarded Tuesday afternoon to R. Russell Stapler, contractor.

The contract was signed by the building committee composed of P. L. Russell, chairman; P. M. Harris, F. M. Rounds and G. B. Dealey, chairman of the board of trustees of the church. Plans and specifications were drawn by the Herbert M. Greene Company, architects. The contract provides for the completion of the building in ninety days.

The new building will be known as Westminster Hall. It will be of the same style of architecture as the church located at Fairmount and Mahon streets, North Dallas, and will be at the rear of the church auditorium. It will be two stories in height. The first story will contain a large Sunday school assembly-room, a kitchenette and classrooms. The second floor will provide additional classrooms. The building will accommodate a Sunday school of from 500 to 600 persons.

Work of tearing down the old frame church building on the site of the new building will be started Thursday morning. The old frame church was erected thirty-three years ago by the congregation on

the old church lot at McKinney avenue and Fairmount street. When the new site was acquired about fifteen years ago at Fairmount and Mahon streets, the frame church was moved there. It has been used for thirty-three years for church and Sunday school purposes.

"The completion of the new building will mark the first step in an extensive program of expansion of the Sunday school and church work," said P. M. Harris, superintendent of membership and classification of the Sunday school and member of the building committee. "The first four Sundays after the new building is completed will be big rally days. In the meantime every member of the church will be solicited to sign a pledge to attend and join a class in the Sunday school on the opening day of the new building and to attend for three consecutive Sundays following."
