

Michael Kostiuk

Born in December 1944 in Texas, self-employed photographer and intermedia/interdisciplinary artist Michael Kostiuk also lived in Pennsylvania, New York, and Maryland. He has also worked as a commercial photographer, cinematographer, project director, and director of a photography gallery. Since 1970 his art works have been presented at over one hundred national and international one person and group exhibitions.

Theme: Stereoscopic photography, shadow, three-dimensional objects, optical illusions, etc.
