Comprehensive resource, includes bibliography and color images.

A well-written, authoritative reference source enhanced by lovely quotes from art historians throughout the centuries.

Extensive and authoritative; includes bibliography.

Covers all aspects of Western art from 1300 to the present day, includes 3,000 entries.

### ► **Where can I find information on a specific movement of art?**

*ArtSpeak: a guide to contemporary ideas, movements, and buzzwords, 1945 to the present.* N 6490 A87 1997 FAL Ref

Discusses art movements since World War II, including the key artists involved.

*ArtSpoke: a guide to modern ideas, movements, and buzzwords, 1848-1944.*

N 6447 A85 1993 FAL Ref

Explores art movements from realism to surrealism.

*Culture Vulture: a guide to style, period, & ism.* N 7560 D86 1994 FAL Ref

Examines key concepts and characteristics of major art movements.

*A Guide to Art.* N 33 G85 1996 FAL Ref

Guide to art history, covers antiquity to current trends. Section one includes chronological essays covering various periods of art history; section two is an alphabetical listing of terms, techniques, styles, and artists.

Abstracts current literature of modern art, photography, and design from 1974 to the present.

[BHA: Bibliography of the History of Art.](#)

Covers Western art from Late Antiquity to the present and contemporary art worldwide, electronic coverage from 1973 to the present.

[Design and Applied Arts Index.](#)

Indexes more than 440 design and design-related journals. Includes data on over 40,000 designers, craftspeople, studios, workshops and design firms, electronic coverage from 1973 to the present.

### ► **How can I find biographical information on an artist?**

Explore The Library Catalog for books on an artist. Search artist's name as both a subject and an author. Some biographical resources are wide in scope, others are rather selective, covering a specific gender, ethnicity, country, or century. Below are some examples of both general and specific biographical resources.

◆ General biographical resources

*Artist Biographies Master Index*. N 40 A78 1986 FAL Ref  
Indexes over 75 biographical dictionaries and includes 275,000 entries.

Comprehensive single volume containing introductory entries.

*Contemporary Artists*. N 6490 C6567 1996 FAL Ready Ref  
Large selection of well-known 20th century artists; includes a biography, list of exhibitions, bibliography, and artists' comments.

*Index to Artistic Biography*. N 40 H38 FAL Ref  
These volumes index 134 sources. Entries provide dates, nationality, and media, as well as references to other resources.

*International Dictionary of Art and Artists*. N 7425 I67 1990 FAL Ref  
Volume one contains artists' entries including a bibliography and a critical look at the artist; volume two contains art works arranged chronologically.

◆ Specific biographical resources

*Women Artists of Color: a bio-critical sourcebook to 20th century artists in the Americas*. N 8354 W656 1999 FAL Ref.

A biographical resource covering minority women artists of the 20th century; includes biographical essays, career highlights, bibliographies, lists of exhibitions, lists of publications, and artist statements.

*Biographical Dictionary of Women Artists in Europe and America since 1850*. N 6757 D86 1990B FAL Ref

Biographical resource covering female artists in the United States and Europe from 1850; includes a bibliography for each artist.

*Contemporary Women Artists*. N 8354 C66 1999 FAL Ref  
More than 350 of the world's most prominent and influential contemporary women artists.

*Dictionary of Women Artists*. N 8354 D53 1997 FAL Ref  
A thorough examination of women artists worldwide and throughout history. Includes exhibition information, selected writings, and bibliographies.

*North American Women Artists of the Twentieth Century: a biographical dictionary*. N 6503 N67 1995 FAL Ref.

Covers women artists from Mexico, Canada, and the U.S.; includes bibliographies.

Eight editions; most recent edition covers to 1996; indexes illustrations in several popular magazines; organized by subject.

*Photography Index.* TR 199 P37 FAL Ref

A guide to reproductions of photographs; includes works chronologically by unknown artists, alphabetically by known artist, and a subject/title index.

*Print Index.* NE 90 P17 1983 FAL Ref

A guide to reproductions of prints; includes artist index and subject/title index.

*Sculpture Index.* NB 36 C55 FAL Ref

A guide to reproductions of sculptures; includes original locations.

*World Architecture Index.* NA 202 T4 1991 FAL Ref

A guide to reproductions of architecture; includes site index, architect index, type index, and alphabetical index of works.

*World Painting Index.* ND 45 H38 FAL Ref

Two volumes and a two-volume supplement; a guide to reproductions of paintings; indexes works by painter, includes title index.

Includes a listing of arts organizations by category including museums, universities, art associations, private galleries, and others.

*M.A. and Ph.D. Programs in Art and Art History.* N 385 C65 1999 FAL Ready Ref  
Covers American and Canadian institutions, includes geographic index and areas of study index.

*M.F.A. Programs in the Visual Arts.* N 328 D57 1999 FAL Ready Ref  
Listing of M.F.A. programs in the United States and Canada, includes areas of study index and geographic index.
