## Descriptions

**In-person classes:** Students, faculty and staff need an EID to log on to computers for hands-on access. The general public is welcome to attend without hands-on access.

**Online classes:** At the class start time, go to <https://meeting.austin.utexas.edu/library-endnote/> select Enter as a Guest, type your name, and click Enter Room. You will need headphones or speakers and Flash 9 (test your version here <http://www.adobe.com/shockwave/welcome/>)

**Advanced EndNote®:** This class covers advanced EndNote® features such as modifying output styles, creating subject bibliographies, using connection files, and more. Attendees should have taken “Introduction to EndNote®” or be familiar with the basics of EndNote®.

**EndNote for Mac Users:** This introductory class covers some of our tricks for using this product on a Mac. Users should bring their own Mac laptops with a copy of EndNote installed and a fully charged battery.

**Introduction to EndNote®:** EndNote’s® publicity says, "Bibliographies made easy!" This introductory class covers some of our tricks for using this product with library databases such as Web of Science. We'll also touch upon our other databases, indexes and the Library Catalog.
