

10 Things You Should Know About the UT Libraries

There are **13 libraries** on campus.

Most libraries have focused collections and are located close to the departments they serve. PCL can provide you with many of the resources and services you will need during your first few years at UT.

You can come to the library just to **study**.

Reserve **group study rooms** online. Pick up a **coffee** on your way in at Prufrock's.

All libraries have **computers** with **Internet** access, Microsoft Office programs, and various design software available for student use.

Many libraries have **wireless** access and/or Ethernet connections for your **laptop**.

Laptops are **available for check out** at PCL, the Fine Arts Library, the Geology Library, or the Flawn Academic Center.

Many library services and resources are available online

at **www.lib.utexas.edu**. Use the Library Catalog to find materials in all libraries.

Articles are available through our online **databases**.

Access these resources on- or off-campus using your EID.

Reading assignments and other items may be placed on print or electronic **reserve** by your professors.

Thousands of **videos, DVDs, and CDs** are available for checkout or library viewing at the Fine Arts Library.

You can **check out** library materials with your **student ID**.

Most books can be checked out for **28 days** and can be renewed online.

You need a **copy card** to **print** and make copies in most of the Libraries.

Blank cards cost \$1.00 and print outs and copies are 13¢ per page.

Purchase a print card at machines located in many libraries.

Print in color for 80¢ a page at PCL, the Fine Arts Library, and the Architecture and Planning Library.

Bevo Bucks can be used to print and copy in PCL.

All libraries have **reference librarians** who will help you with research and projects.
